Skip navigation! The Lovebirds is a gift that Insecure and Silicon Valley fans and lovers of action comedy are sure to love. It was expected to be released in theaters, but thankfully Netflix scooped up the cinema-less Lovebirds. In the past, choosing new ringtones on Android was a bit difficult compared to creating ringtones on iOS, but things are now much easier and you don't need special software. Here's everything you need to know about creating ringtones for Android and how to turn songs into ringtones. In a few simple steps, you can turn your ringtone into something more personal than the standard ringtone that comes with your smartphone. Here's what to do. On your smartphone's home screen, tap Apps. Tap Settings. Tap Sounds and Notifications. If it's not listed in Quick Settings, scroll down to find it. Tap Ringtone >. Select tracks from songs that are already stored on your phone. You can also tap albums, artists, or folders, as well as search by name, if you have multiple audio files on your smartphone. Tap the song you want to use. Tap done. Songs or audio files are now your ringtones. Just look back for steps to change it again. With some songs, you may not want to riff open like your ringtone. If you want to select a clip from a song, you need a dedicated app to do the job. The RingDroid app is one of the best and takes a few seconds to use and cuts a song. Here's how to cut a song. Download and open the RingDroid app. Tap the post file you want to edit. Tap Trim, then drag your finger around the clip, cutting it down exactly what you want to hear. Tap download. Tap play to hear the preview. Tap save. Tap Use As. Tap Ringtone, and then tap Done to set the ringtone. Want to set other ringtones for different people, so you know exactly who's calling? It's simple enough, once you know how. Tap Contacts. Move on the person you want to add a custom ringtone to, and then tap the name of the contact. Tap Edit. Tap Ringtones. Select the ringtone, and then tap OK. Who runs the world? How about an attack by 50 Ft Woman-style Beyoncé? Using the ability to edit songs in iTunes, you can convert any song into a personal ringtone for your iPhone. All you have to do is create a copy of your favorite track and then tweak it a bit to make it into an iPhone ringtone you can use. Ringtones must be 30 seconds or less, so you'll have to choose which part of the song you want to use. Start iTunes. If prompted, sign in with the same Apple ID and password you use for your iPhone. Drag the music file to the iTunes Music library, or press Ctrl-O to import it. Locate songs in your music library or playlist. Right-click the file name and select Get Info. Click the Options tab in the window that opens. Click the check box next to Start time and Stop time of the song and change the time it takes for a song to be 30 seconds or more. If you want to start a one-minute song, change Start Time to 1:00 and Stop Time to 1:30. Click OK. Right-click the song again. This time, select Create an AAC version to make a copy of your song in AAC format. If you don't see this option, you'll need to change your iTunes options (see next step). A duplicate 30-second version of the song appears in the music library below the original. you don't have the option to create an AAC version of the song, press Ctrl-B to display the iTunes Menu bar. Then select Options from the Edit menu and click the Import settings button on the General tab. Click the Import use menu and and AAC Encoding. Click OK twice to close the Options window. Right-click your original song file -- the file is still visible full-time -- and select Get info again. Highlight and delete Start Time and Stop Time, and then click OK. Open Windows Control Panel, select Appearance and Personalization, and then click Folder Options. Click the View tab, and then clear the check box next to Hide extensions for known file types. You need to be able to view the song's file extension to turn it into a ringtone file. Right-click the 30-second AAC version of the song in iTunes and select Open in Windows Explorer. Right-click the file in Windows Explorer and choose Rename. Highlight the user's .mp3 and replace it with the .m4r file extension used for ringtones. Press Enter. Click the menu button in the upper-left corner of iTunes, which says Music and selects Tone. Your new ringtone appears on this page, inging that you changed the file extension correctly. Connect your iPhone to your computer using a USB cable. Select your iPhone when iPhone appears at the top right of the iTunes window. Click the Tones tab, and then click the Sync Tone button. Click Apply, and then Sync After sync is complete, close iTunes and disconnect the USB cable. Launch Settings from the iPhone home screen. Scroll down and tap Sound. Scroll down again and tap Ringtones. You can now choose your custom ringtone from the list of available options.
